THE ROLE OF BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE:

Your Beautification Committee's goal is to identify areas in Lee Plantation that need improvement or attention. We will plan and submit a yearly budget that is workable for the community. We will create a plan that continues to improve and beautify our common grounds. We recognize the importance of providing nature areas for small animals and pollinators. Protecting nature is crucial to our environment.

We know the importance of research and will identify plants and trees that fit the planting zone where we live.

Beautification strives to be a positive resource in our community. We do that by providing information to home owners that will improve their individual landscape and add value to their property and also the community.

Beautification each year holds a Christmas Extravaganza event. This occurs on the 22nd of every December. This is our way of celebrating our gardens with luminaries, Christmas decorations a parade and of course Santa.

BUDGET AND DONATIONS:

- There was no set budget this year for beautification. We worked with our board to purchase what is needed to bring our community up to par.
- Beautification still has \$1107.88 in donation money.

IRRIGATION:

- This is a big issue because the water from our lake has a large salt content following Hurricane Ian.
- We have lost fruit trees as they are not tolerable to salt water.
- We need more rain and since salt water is heavier than fresh water, we hope it settles to the bottom of the lake. This may help the salinity of our lake and allow for better irrigation over time.
- Our lake water is getting additional testing. This will be done on a regular basis.
- We are still anticipating that some irrigation pipes may need replacing. Work is being done also on pump that runs the irrigation. Updates will follow.
- We continue to hand water trees and plants as needed.
